
Meeting Minutes

Streamflow and Snowpack Report – Luke Lutz, Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation

- Streamflows: (June 18th, 2025)
 - o Wisdom (06024450): 32 cfs
 - o Big Hole River near Wise River (41D 08000): 761 cfs
 - Maiden Rock (06025250): 1,100 cfs
 - o Melrose (06025500): 1,120 cfs
 - o Glen (06026210): 1,160 cfs
 - Hamilton Ditch (06026420): 954
 - Stream And Gage Explorer (StAGE): https://gis.dnrc.mt.gov/apps/stage/
- Snowpack:
 - Snow Water Equivalent: 85% of average (1991-2020)
 - Peak ~2 weeks early; nearly melted out ~2 weeks early
- Precipitation: 6% of average (1991-2020)
 - Standardized Precipitation

- Climate Outlook (NOAA):





- Outlook: The 8-14 day outlook predicts near normal temperatures and slightly above normal precipitation.
- Seasonal Outlook: The seasonal outlooks above normal temperatures and below below normal precipitation.
- U.S. Seasonal Drought Outlook: Drought persists in our area.


Director's Report – Pedro Marques, Executive Director

 BHWC key player in changes to Army Corps of Engineers permitting at national level:
 - Eliminates need for costly wetland delineations for low-tech restorative practices in streams and wetlands.
 - Eliminates double oversight by federal entities, expanding use of binding landowner agreements to BLM.
 - NWP proposed rules are published in the Federal
